Mrs. Piper has been working hard with the students to put together an amazing show and we look forward to seeing the students shine!
- 3) On **Wednesday**, **June 26**<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon we are having the Grade 5 Leaving Ceremony. In order to make sure we don't run out of time, we're going to start at 12:45 (not 1:00) and the gym doors will open at 12:15 for those of you who will be attending. This is always an exciting event for our Grade 5s and we look forward to sharing the slide show, certificates, and a treat at the end in recognition of their last year here.
- 4) The last day for students is Thursday, June 27<sup>th</sup>, and they finish that day at 11:15. Report cards are given out at the end of class that day, so please be sure to read over it with your child to celebrate their successes and look for fun things to do over the summer to keep their skills up for September!
