- \*All students will participate in our annual school bus evacuation drill on Tuesday. Students in grades 1-5 will participate beginning at 9:00 and the Kindergarten students beginning at 10:30. One of the methods of evacuation requires students to jump out the back door of the bus, with assistance, onto a rubber mat a height of approximately one meter. Appropriate footwear for this day would help to ensure student safety.
- \*Our first hot lunch comes from McDonalds and will be delivered on Friday, September 26<sup>th</sup>. If you would like to place an order for your child, the deadline for orders is <u>this week</u> on Wednesday at midnight. Orders need to be made on MunchaLunch, which you can access here: MunchaLunch
- \*We hope to see you out to our Meet the Teacher Open House on Thursday, from 5 6pm. We'll have a slice of cheese pizza for you if you come by the undercover area outside at the front office and teachers will be ready to welcome you to your child's class to introduce themselves. Students always look forward to sharing their classroom and school with families so we hope to see lots of you out! If you or your child need a gluten- or dairy-free pizza option, please email to let me know.
- \*Friday is a busy day with the Cops for Cancer tour coming through at 10:15 and then our Terry Fox run in the afternoon. Kindergarten and Grade 1 students will be running in the field at school and students in Grades 2 5 will be going to Sardis Park. We are asking if families can donate 'Two Toonies for Terry' as teachers will be accepting donations all week long. Our goal for the Terry Fox Foundation is \$1100 and every dollar helps!
