*On Monday morning we are fortunate to have the Dancers of Damelahamid presenting for the students. It's especially exciting as two of our students are part of the group so will be presenting to their peers! Here is some information about the presentation:

The Dancers of Damelahamid's young audience production is In Abundance – Hloxsa 'Wii hun. A central theme is based on the salmon cycle and conveys important cultural teachings on balance, community, and sustainability. The salmon symbolize abundance and are a key reminder of the importance to value and protect this essential resource. Another key teaching of In Abundance is that when we take only what we need there is plenty for all, including the salmon needed to spawn for the next year's cycle. These teachings are demonstrated through various stories and masked dances.

*Wednesday, April 29th, is the last day to order in MunchaLunch for the Joey's Fish Shack hot lunch that is taking place on Friday, May 8th.
